CSBA believes there will be negative consequences by imposing costly and unnecessary state mandated programs on school districts and county offices of education. Staff is, therefore, recommending that the Board adopt this resolution in opposition to Assembly Bill 954. If adopted, the Superintendent will forward the resolution to the California School Boards Association and our Legislators.

RESOLUTION 02-03-39

RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO ASSEMBLY BILL 954 (GOLDBERG): TEACHERS BILL OF RIGHTS

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 954 by Assembly Member Jackie Goldberg (Democrat-Los Angeles) is being considered by the California State Legislature and would establish a bill of rights for teachers that would reduce local flexibility and increase costs to local districts and would not benefit students; and

WHEREAS, teachers should continue to have the professional freedom to establish a delivery of standards-based instruction; however, consistence in the content standards that students receive cannot vary from classroom to classroom; and

WHEREAS, the professional expertise of teachers are valued and their knowledge and input are an integral part of the development of all educational processes; and

WHEREAS, teachers are a key element of the broader education team, which includes elected governing boards, administrators, school site administrators, and classroom aides, who together collaborate to ensure the academic achievement of all students; and

WHEREAS, our state system of accountability sets high academic standards for all students and staff, and ensures that we measure progress toward these expectations; and

WHEREAS, parents currently have the opportunity to provide input into the services that their children receive at school and we oppose any efforts that limit their ability to have a free and open dialogue with the individuals who provide services to their children; and

WHEREAS, individual schools and their communities should focus on building support for all educational stakeholders placing students first; and

WHEREAS, current law does not prohibit classroom teachers from participating in the development of educational processes; and

WHEREAS, AB 954 would impose a costly and unnecessary state mandated program on school districts and county offices of education; and

WHEREAS, considering the state's current fiscal condition, we do not support any efforts that would increase administrative costs at the expense of classroom needs; and

WHEREAS, school districts vary throughout the state in terms of size and need and it is important that flexibility be provided in the delivery of state and local programs; and

WHEREAS, the management, operation, and distribution of resources clearly rests on locally elected school board members who are ultimately accountable for the results; and

WHEREAS, the assurance of a high quality education and a highly motivated professional staff in a safe and clean school environment rests with all members of the local school community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the San Jacinto Unified School District joins the California School Boards Association in its strong opposition to AB 954 (Goldberg); an unnecessary, costly and short-sighted measure.
